- 8% of the U.S. East Coast container soy trade flows through the Port of Savannah each year.
- Total U.S. export of broken or unbroken soy totals 50,543,582 short tons. Of this total, the Port of Savannah exports 83,251 short tons.
- Total U.S. export of flours and meals of soybeans totals 2,127,919 short tons. Of this total, the Port of Savannah exports 107,509 short tons.
- Total U.S. export of soybean oilcake and other solid residue totals 7,422,371 short tons. Of this total, the Port of Savannah exports 38,216 short tons and the Port of Brunswick exports 744,145 short tons. This makes the Port of Savannah the number one exporter of Soybean meal on the U.S. East Coast, number two for refined soybean oil and number three for the overall containerized soy trade. Brunswick is also the number one exporter of Soybean oilcake on the U.S. East Coast.
- Total U.S. export of soybean oil, refined, and fractions, not modified totals 41,132 short tons. Of this total, the Port of Savannah exports 6,787 short tons.
- Total U.S. export of soybean oil & fractions, crude, whether or not degummed totals 769,442 short tons. Of this total, the Port of Savannah exports 915 short tons.
